### CONTEXT:

The Generation Equality High-level Multistakeholder and Intergenerational Dialogue will lead with an update on the forward trajectory for Generation Equality inclusive of both the Executive Director's vision for its future success and concrete updates on progress made since the closure of the <u>Generation Equality Forum</u> in Paris. Generation Equality partners will be invited to share progress on their work, lessons learned, and opportunities ahead. Discussions will focus on how multistakeholder partnerships and civil society and youth leadership and agency can drive transformative change for women and girls worldwide.

The session will reaffirm UN Women's commitment to ensure stakeholders' continued leadership and engagement (particularly civil society and youth) throughout the implementation phase. The event will act as a powerful call for further engagement in the work of the Action Coalitions to advance gender equality over the next five years.
