## GENERATION EQUALITY FORUM IN KENYA FIRST ANNIVERSARY – JUNE 2022

Generation Equality Forum (GEF) is an international platform that seeks to mobilize diverse stakeholders to accelerate the implementation of the gender equality commitments made during the fourth world conference on women held in Beijing in, 1995. GEF is anchored on the following six thematic areas that are led by Action Coalitions: i) Gender Based Violence, ii) Economic justice and rights, iii) Bodily autonomy and sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR), iv) Feminist action for climate justice, v) Technology and innovation for Gender Equality; and, vi) Feminist movements and leadership.

With Kenya as a leader in the Action Coalition on Gender Based Violence, H.E. President Uhuru Kenyatta made 12 concrete Commitments at the Generation Equality Forum in Paris in June, 2021. The Commitments aim at increasing the momentum of ending all forms of Gender Based Violence (GBV) and Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) in Kenya by 2026. A five-year road map (2021-2026) was developed through a consultative process with State and Non-State actors in the gender space. Below is a summary report on the progress of implementation of the Commitments during the first year 2020- 2021.


